



## Brian Parker

College: Frostburg State

Head Coach



Brian Parker begins his sixth season as head coach of the Frostburg State University women's soccer program. The 1992 FSU graduate is the winningest Bobcat women's soccer coach with a 65-29-10 record in his five seasons. FSU has won the Allegheny Mountain Collegiate Conference championship and advanced to the NCAA Tournament in his first four years and an ECAC Tournament appearance in the fifth.

Last season, Parker's Bobcats finished the season 12-7 overall and undefeated in the AMCC (9-0) for the second time during his tenure. For the fourth-straight season, Frostburg State hosted the AMCC Tournament but was upset in the championship by Penn State Behrend, 2-1. However, FSU reached the postseason for the sixth-straight year, fifth under Parker, when it earned a spot in the ECAC Tournament.

In 2005, Parker continued his successful run at Frostburg State posting a 12-6-2 overall record and an 8-0-1 slate in the AMCC. In the AMCC Tournament, FSU shutout La Roche 4-0 in the semifinal round, and later captured the championship defeating Penn State Behrend, 4-3, in a penalty kick shootout. In the opening round of the NCAA Tournament, the Bobcats fell to No. 12 Denison 2-0.

Parker earned his second straight AMCC Coach of the Year award in 2004 after guiding the Bobcats to a 14-3-3 overall record (at .775 the best winning percentage in program history) and an 8-1 mark in the AMCC. FSU hosted the AMCC Tournament for the second consecutive year and blanked Pitt-Greensburg 2-0 in the semifinals before capturing the conference crown with a thrilling 3-2 double-overtime victory over Penn State Behrend.

For the second consecutive year, the Bobcats squared off with Westminster in the opening round of the NCAA Tournament, where the teams battled through two overtimes before the Bobcats pulled out the win with a 5-3 victory in penalty kicks. The Bobcats then dropped a hard-fought 2-1 decision to No. 24 Christopher Newport in the second round.

In his second campaign, Parker was named the AMCC Coach of the Year after leading the Bobcats to a 16-5 overall record (the second-most wins in team history behind the 2001 squad's 17-5 mark) and a perfect 6-0 finish in the AMCC (their first undefeated record in the conference's seven-year existence).

The Bobcats, who set a school record with 12 straight wins, captured their first AMCC regular-season title and hosted the conference tournament for the first time as well. FSU defeated Penn State Behrend 4-2 in the final to win its third straight AMCC crown and earned a third consecutive berth in the NCAA

Division III Tournament.

The Bobcats were chosen to host an NCAA match for the first time in school history and made the most of the opportunity, defeating Westminster 3-2 for their first NCAA Tournament victory in three tries. FSU turned in another strong performance in the region semifinals but were edged by No. 2 Scranton 1-0.

In his debut season, Parker guided the Bobcats to a 10-8-4 record and the No. 3 seed in the AMCC Tournament. In the semifinals, FSU slipped past No. 3 Pitt-Greensburg 2-1 in overtime and then upset No. 1 La Roche, 3-1 in a shootout, to capture the conference title. The Bobcats earned an at-large bid to the NCAA Tournament, where they fell to Westminster 4-1 in the first round.

Prior to returning to western Maryland, Parker served as head girls soccer coach at Urbana High School in Frederick County, Md., since the school's opening in 1995. He guided the Hawks to an impressive 62-36-6 record and a pair of regional championships during his tenure.

In just his second season at Urbana, Parker was named the Frederick County Coach of the Year after leading a team of freshmen and sophomores to the school's first-ever regional championship crown. The Hawks, who posted winning records in six of Parker's seven years, earned their second regional title in 2001.

Parker is no stranger to FSU, as he was a goalkeeper for the Bobcats from 1987-89. He was a member of two Eastern College Athletic Conference Tournament qualifiers, including the 1989 squad that won the ECAC South Region Championship.

Parker then coached the FSU women's soccer team as a club sport from 1990-1992 and received his degree in social sciences with a teaching certification from FSU in 1992. He moved on to West Virginia University where he served as a graduate assistant for the Mountaineer men's team for two years while earning a master's in political science.

Parker, who has a USSF "B" coaching license as well as an Premier Diploma from the NSCAA, is frequently on the Maryland Olympic Development Program Staff and recently led the Maryland 1990 Girls team to the Region I Tournament championship. That team eventually won the ODP National Championship in Texas in March 2006.

Parker was also a founder and staff coach with the Frederick United Soccer Club (now FC Frederick) until his return to FSU. He and his wife, Karen, a 1993 FSU graduate and native of Frostburg, have two children — Elise (6) and Matthew (4).

## Jodie Gittleston

College: Frostburg State

Assistant Coach

Gittleston begins her first year on the staff after graduating from FSU in 2006 with her bachelor's degree in early childhood/elementary education.

She was a four-year starter for the Bobcats appearing in 78 games from 2002-2005 and captained the team her senior year. She scored 20 career goals playing as a center midfielder and was named to All-Allegheny Mountain Collegiate Conference teams and won AMCC Championships in each of her four years as a player.

Gittleston has been coaching youth teams in Montgomery County (Md.) and regularly staffs FSU camps as well as camps

and clinics based at the Rockville Sportsplex in Rockville, Maryland. She is a 2002 graduate of Wootton high school and played club soccer in the Seneca and Bethesda clubs.

She is currently pursuing a master of education degree while serving as the primary assistant coach for women's soccer.



## Brandon Rethemeyer

College: Frostburg State

Assistant Coach

Rethemeyer enters his third season as an assistant coach with the men's soccer team but first as a graduate assistant and first helping coach the women's soccer team. He will help coach the goalkeepers for both of the FSU teams.

Rethemeyer, who transferred into Frostburg State from Hagerstown CC, was a keeper for the Bobcats in the 2003 and 2004 seasons. He helped FSU to a combined 21-15-4 overall record including one ECAC Tournament appearance. In 2005, Rethemeyer traveled with the Bobcats to Scotland, where he played against professional, semi-professional and amateur teams, during a nine-day tour of the country.

Rethemeyer not only brings playing knowledge to the Bobcat

staff but a solid resume of coaching experience as well. He has been an instructor at both the Rich Daughtridge and Frostburg State Soccer Camps and the Denison Cabral Soccer Academy.

Last year, Rethemeyer served as a graduate assistant in the sports information office.

Rethemeyer graduated in May 2006, with his bachelor's degree in health and physical education. He is working on his master's degree in education with a concentration in human performance.

Fresh off its sixth-straight postseason appearance, the Frostburg State women's soccer team is again expecting big things in 2007. FSU returns all but one of last year's starters and coupled with having one of the largest rosters in team history, will look to regain the AMCC title which it held from 2001-2005.

"We have terrific depth at every position," said head coach Brian Parker. "From top to bottom we have the most talent since I arrived at FSU and we should have plenty of scoring with four players back who scored six or more goals last fall."

Despite the "scoring by committee" attitude on offense, Parker feels that his backline could potentially have the most talent and depth.

"Our learning curve should be short in the back with the great returning group of players we have," stated Parker. "We have more depth than ever before."

Senior **Tori Walter (Frederick, Md./Frederick)** is a two-year starter at center back and returns to the position this year. She has started all 39 games during her career and has scored one goal and added three assists on the offensive side of the ball. On defense, she has helped the Bobcats to limit opponents to 33 goals during those 39 games including just 13 scores during the 2005 season.

Sophomore **Katie Emminger (Baltimore, Md./Perry Hall)** and junior transfer **Rebecca Waldo (Vestal, N.Y./Vestal)** will battle for the other center back spot. Emminger has been injured throughout the preseason and Waldo has slid into the starting role. Emminger scored three goals and handed out four assists while starting all 19 games last year while Waldo was a NSCAA and NJCAA All-American in 2006 at Broome CC (N.Y.).

Juniors **Jackie Donovan (Hollidaysburg, Pa./Hollidaysburg Area)** and **Tricia Richardson (Gibson Island, Md./St. Mary's)** have locked down the two wide back defensive positions. Donovan started all 39 games since her freshman season scoring a goal and an assist. Richardson started 24 games in her first two seasons scoring four goals and five assists. This season she has settled back into her natural position (defense) after playing in the midfield a year ago.

Senior **Sarah Huber (Walkersville, Md./Walkersville)** should be in the mix for playing time on the back line. One of just three seniors on this year's squad, she has played in 46 games during her career. Providing good depth at the position are freshmen **Heather Fleishell (Middletown, Md./Middletown)**, **Heather Brubaker (Mechanicsville, Md./Chopticon)**, **Kirsten Marshall (Elkins, W.Va./Elkins)** and **Anne Patron (Baltimore, Md./Dulaney)**.

In the midfield, senior **Jen Naylor (Riva, Md./St. Mary's)** and sophomore **Lauren Lentine (Princeton, N.J./WWP North)** have earned the starting spots in the center. Naylor is a three-year starter and a team captain who will anchor the midfield. She has netted 13 career goals while starting 56 games. Lentine had an impressive season in her first year with FSU. She tied for the team lead with 11 goals and was awarded with First-Team All-Conference honors.

The two wide positions are still up for grabs as the season



heads into full swing, but senior **Anita Wickerham (Morgantown, Pa./Twin Valley)** and freshman **Lauren Russell (Waldorf, Md./Westlake)** appear to have an edge so far. Wickerham has scored five goals and five assists in 50 games while Russell was a Washington Post All-Met and Maryland All-State selection last year as a senior at Westlake.

Local products **Shonna Feree (Frostburg, Md./Beall)** and **Kiersten Stevenson (Frostburg, Md./Beall)** have also looked good in the preseason and will compete for playing time in the midfield in their first year with the program.

Sophomore **Kelly Sanzone (Jarrettsville, Md./North Harford)**, who has fully recovered from a knee injury last season, and two more very promising newcomers will also battle for time in the midfield: **Chrissy Conrad (Frederick, Md./Tuscarora)** and **Natalie Miller (Poolesville, Md./Poolesville)**.

Sophomore **Amanda Drake (Montgomery Village, Md./Watkins Mill)** will lead the front line in 2007 as she is the only returning starter from last season up top. She had nine goals and led the team with five assists and has the potential to be one of the best scorers in the region.

Sophomore **Christine Fitzgerald (Gaithersburg, Md./Gaithersburg)** and freshman **Stephanie Parker (Dundalk, Md./Catholic)** are in close competition for a starting role as well. Fitzgerald scored 10 goals last season while Parker was a Baltimore Sun All-City First-Team selection as a senior at Catholic. Returning players **Ali Keeney (Smithsburg, Md./Middletown)** and **Kaleigh Herring (Perry Hall, Md./North Harford)** both had a strong preseason and will compete for time upfront as well.

In net, sophomore **Stephanie Gwinn (Ijamsville, Md./Urbana)** will be the starter after earning First-Team All-AMCC honors and limiting opponents to a 0.46 goals against average last season. Senior **Amanda LaPorta (Westminster, Md./Westminster)** has joined the soccer team as a reserve keeper this season. She has been a member of the Bobcat women's basketball team for her first three years at FSU.

"I think we've raised the bar once again for our program with the overall quality of our personnel and with the competitiveness we need to create within the team to improve every week. We could really accomplish a lot this year," said Parker.

Former Frostburg State soccer players, Jodie Gittleston and Brandon Rethemeyer, have joined the coaching staff this season. Gittleston was a four-year starter for the Bobcats playing in 78 games and scoring 20 career goals. She was an All-AMCC selection and AMCC Champion in each of her four years with FSU. Rethemeyer played for the Bobcats in the 2003 and 2004 seasons. He helped the men's team to a 21-15-4 and one ECAC Tournament appearance during his tenure.

The Bobcats will also take on one of the toughest schedules in the Division III ranks this season. The Bobcats have their work cut out for them as they face five 2006 NCAA Tournament participants and two teams that enter the season ranked in the top-25 according to the preseason NSCAA Poll: the College of New Jersey (No. 2) and Johns Hopkins (No. 16).

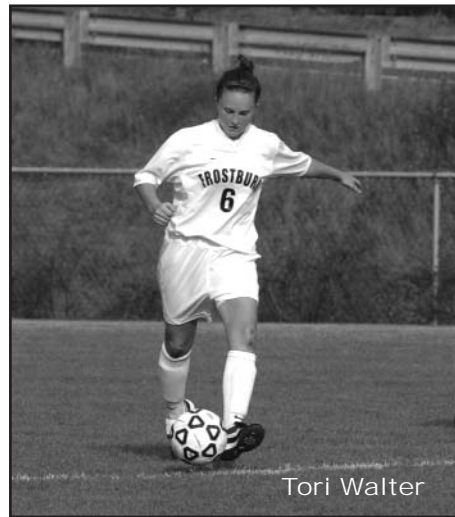

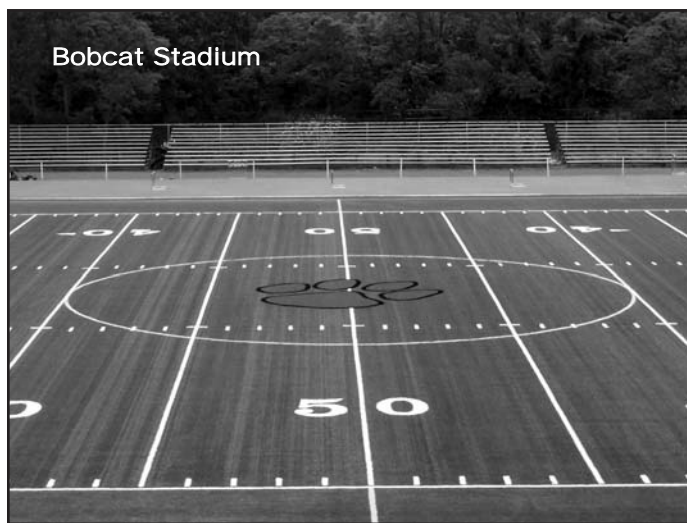
